Schiffer Publishing to release the most comprehensive photographic survey to date of Mies van der Rohe's Farnsworth House in May, 2006


Avant-garde photographer Paul Clemence celebrates the revered icon of Modernist architecture, Mies van der Rohe's Farnsworth House, in a new book to be released by Schiffer Publishing later this year. Over 70 striking black-and-white and color photographs reveal both the essence of the design's architectural details, as well as the architect's unique vision. John T. A collection of 40 black-and-white postcards will be released in conjunction with this book.

About the Photographer

American born, but raised in Brazil, Paul Clemence has taken his design sensibility, acquired while attending the School of Architecture at Universidade Federal do Rio de Janeiro, and transposed it unto film, resulting in some of the most avant-garde photographs of relevant buildings throughout the world.

Based in Miami Beach, Florida, he developed a collection of classic black and white images of the

famed Art Deco District that were available as signed framed prints and post cards. The immense popularity of this collection culminated with the publishing of his first book, South Beach architectural photographs in 2004, by Schiffer Publishing, Ltd.
